# Read the passage and answer the questions below

Coronavirus Disease is now spreading within counties in Kenya, from person-to-person through contact with droplets when an infected person speaks, coughs or sneezes or through touching contaminated surfaces and objects. Covid-19 is however preventable. Take all precautions to protect yourself from Covid-19 through regular handwashing/use of sanitizers, wearing masks, practicing social distancing and avoiding non-essential travel or crowding. Maintain a healthy lifestyle to boost your immunity by eating a balanced diet including fruits and vegetables, getting at least 8 hours of sleep, keeping physically active and reducing stress as much as possible. Ensure that you remain socially connected with your loved ones remotely ie by telephone and social media. Call your health care provider if you develop symptoms that could be consistent with COVID-19 and which may appear 2-14 days after exposure-fever, cough or shortness of breath.

Even with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and social distancing, HIV treatment and prevention, messages on drug and substance abuse and mental health still continue to be shared. It is important to go for HIV testing to know your HIV status and that of your sexual partner. Having sex with multiple partners increases the risk of HIV infection. If your HIV test is positive, visit a health facility and start medication. ARVs are free in all government health facilities. Alcohol and drug use is harmful to your mental and physical health. With a weakened immune system due to drug

abuse, one is more at risk of contracting COVID-19. Good mental health is part of good health and so people with mental illness should seek medical attention. Ensure to be socially connected with your loved ones. Mental issues are not necessarily evil spirit possession and can be diagnosed at the hospital.
